Expectations: Teaching Artists must be able to plan and facilitate engaging art activities for groups of 20-30 elementar students with the help of an after-school counselor. Must demonstrate classroom management skills and be able to create fun and peaceful environment. Must document activity plan with Arts Coordinator before the day of the lesson. Teachin Artist must be able to incorporate feedback from the After-School Site Coordinators and the Arts Coordinator. Teachin artists are assigned to new schools 4xs during the school year. Each school assignment lasts for 8-10 weekly sessions.
Hours: Instructional hours may vary based on the school assignment, but most arts enrichment programs will take place as [2 back-to-back hour-long sessions between 3-4pm and 4-5pm. In addition to instructional hours, Teaching Artists ar compensated for [1] hour per class to account for set up and breakdown, and [1] hour per week to cover lesson plannin time. Teachers must submit lesson plan to Arts Coordinator before the day of the lesson to receive pay for planning hour Total available paid hours each week = 4 hours per school.
