Admission fee is waived for students attending Title I schools. Schools are responsible for their own transportation to the North Charleston Performing Arts Center, located at 5001 Coliseum Drive, North Charleston, SC 29418. All performances begin at 10:00am and last approximately one hour. Groups of 10+ must register in advance. Reservation forms are available on the Arts & Culture section of the City's website at northcharleston.org.
