Each eligible school may request up to three free programs per school year to take place during the regular school day by choosing one offering from each program category: Performing Arts, Literary Arts & Storytelling, and Visual Arts.

CANCELLATION/RESCHEDULING POLICY:

Once a booking is confirmed and under contract, cancellation by the school for any reason other than an act of God (an inevitable, unpredictable, and unreasonably severe event caused by natural forces without any human interference, and over which an insured party has no control, such as an earthquake, flood, hurricane, lightning, snowstorm) may result in the school's forfeiting participation in the outreach program for that year. If a booking needs to be rescheduled due to a school scheduling conflict, the school liaison must notify and request a new date through the arts coordinator, not the artist.

FUNDING SOURCES:

These programs are made possible through funding from the City of North Charleston and the South Carolina Arts Commission, which receives support from the National Endowment for the Arts.

PERFORMING ARTS PROGRAMS

Schools are eligible to receive one large assembly type (200 attendees or more) visit per year from a performing artist or group listed below. Performances range from 45 minutes to one hour. Performance workshops are available for small assembly type groups (less than 200 attendees). This program does not fund performance residencies. To participate, complete one **PA Form** and mail, email, or fax it to the Cultural Arts Department. We will make arrangements with the performer(s) and then confirm your requested time and date. The three categories of performing arts to choose from are Dance, Music, and Theatre.

DANCE

DENINUFAY AFRICAN DRUM & DANCE COMPANY

All Ages • Social Studies: Gullah Geechee/West African Connection • Assembly or Workshop

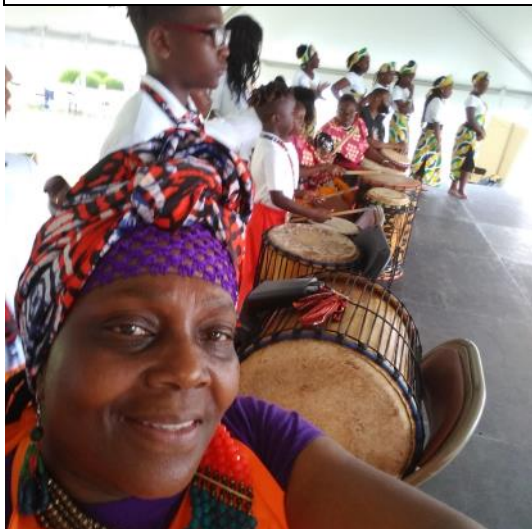


Deninufay African Drum & Dance Co. is a dance company that specializes in West African, modern, contemporary, and praise dancing, as well as drumming, monologues, and musical theater with an ecstatic afro flair. Under the direction of **Charlene Horlback**, the company has been in existence for more than 20 years. Their mission is to uplift, empower, and inspire the lives of our youth one captivating dance at a time. Their live drum orchestra will place you right in the heart of Guinea, West Africa. Through this program, students will experience the culture of Africa through music, dance, instruments (using mathematical structure), communication, fashion, and West African chants! Students will learn movements straight from

Guinea, common phrases in the Key Swahili language, how and why the rhythms are played, and how the Gullah Geechee culture correlates with the heritage and customs of West African tribes. Deninufay loves getting their audience members involved by inviting them on stage to shine bright and help play tunes that will bring melodic music to ears and rhythm to feet! All Ages · STEAM: Physics, Sound · Assembly or Workshop

STEM/STEAM value! Inspiration for young builders! **Brien Engel** expertly plays the glass harp, an instrument comprised of 50 drinking glasses, which is played using friction by rubbing his wet fingers on their rims. This beguiling art form dates back to the 18th century, and Brien is one of a handful of modern practitioners. His repertoire includes contemporary tunes as well as jazz standards and classics by Mozart and Bach. During an assembly, he also plays other musical instruments made from everyday materials and colorfully explores their origins. Special attention is given to relating concepts of physics and sound to our everyday lives, with captivating object lessons. These are customized to support sound physics units taught in class. Another segment of the program introduces Ben Franklin’s favorite invention, the Glass Armonica. Questions and song requests are welcome towards the end of this inspiring performance. MASK STORYTELLING WITH DOUG BERKY

5K-12th • Theatre Appreciation: Masks, Mimes • Literature: Folk Tales • Assembly
6th-12th • Careers in the Arts: Performance, Set Design, Choreography, Mask Construction • Workshop



Doug Berky's performances weave together classic theatre forms of mime, mask theatre, circus arts, physical comedy and storytelling. Doug is also known internationally for his mask construction. He designs and constructs the masks for his own performances as well as creates all of the sets, choreography, scripts and many of the costumes. He presents programs for students PreK-12th as well as workshops and residencies focusing on unmasking literature with mask communication and cooperation with masks and physical theatre.

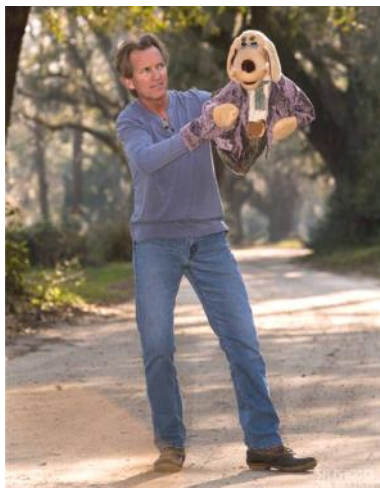
No Show (all ages) A performance has been scheduled, but the actor fails to show. Or does he? What will happen when a lone spectator finds himself unwittingly on stage? Doug is transformed into several characters ranging from a gorilla to a ballerina as he explores the props and masks on stage. Students experience a variety of theatre forms: mime, mask theater, circus arts, and storytelling. The performance pieces vary in length, characters, and subject depending on the age of the audience.

Gems: The World's Wisdom Stories (CD-5th) Doug Berky introduces a collection of wisdom stories from around the world. All people seek to understand the world, to live in peace, to deal justly with one another. These stories of hope, peace, freedom and justice will inspire while introducing students to literature from other cultures including Greece, India, Native America, and tales from Europe and South America. Doug has three versions of this production for the different age groups including a preschool version to help introduce young students to masks and stories.

Foibles, Fables and Other Imaskinations (4th grade and up) A beautiful and striking retelling of old, even ancient stories that speak to common human struggles experienced throughout history and across cultures and the humor and spirit summoned to resolve them. Stories that may be included in the performance are "A Simple Gift", a medieval story from France about giving; and "The Crocodile and the Monkey", a Jataka tale of caution from India.

He designs and constructs all of his Golden Rod Puppets as well as the beautiful sets that surround them, and he performs his original works all over the world.

Animalia (CD-6th) Hobey Ford's ANIMALIA explores the magical world of animals and features Hobey's original "foamies" puppets carved from large blocks of foam with intricate mechanical design that gives each puppet realistic movements. Hobey breaks out of the traditional puppet theater booth turning the whole theater into his performance stage. ANIMALIA introduces the audience to the metamorphosis of a butterfly and a tadpole, various ecological systems and endangered animals.

World Tales (CD-6th) Hobey brings the Caldecott award winning art of Gail Haley to life with a two dimensional rod puppet rendition of Gail's West African Anansi tale **A Story, A Story**. Follow the trickster Anansi the Spider Man as he wins "the golden box of stories", the source of all storytelling. Next, travel to ancient Greece for a hilarious up-to-date retelling of Aesop's **"The Ant and the Grasshopper"**, told through colorful three dimensional rod puppets. Science: Children will learn how circus skills are related to Newtonian vocabulary, forces and motion, gravity, velocity, momentum and more.

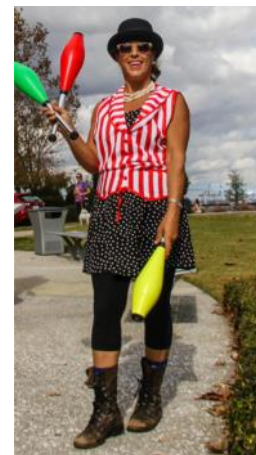
Technology: Children will learn how circus is related to industry and careers.

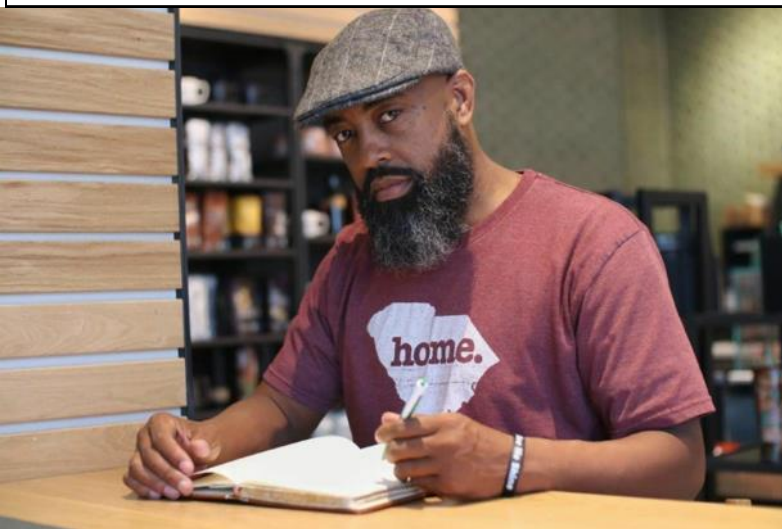

Theresa Hilliard of Mama Doonk's Gullah is a retired Equal Employment Opportunity/Diversity Manager, and author of *Mama Doonk's Gullah Recipes* (first and second editions) and *A Guide to Charleston's African American Historical Markers*.

She is a Gullah storyteller/lecturer, artist-in-residence, historian, certified tour guide, and interpreter at the Old Slave Mart Museum. Theresa grew up in the Gullah culture on Edisto Island. She is an expert in the Gullah language and culture and uses her expertise to engage her audience throughout her presentations. Her presentations address how the Gullah language was developed, who the Gullah-Geechee people are and why they were given that name. Theresa incorporates a show and tell segment centered on items she grew up with before the modern conveniences of today, and shares some history of Gullah dishes featured in her books. She discusses how spirituals were used amongst African Americans to communicate and sings some old Negro Spirituals. She addresses history on how Charleston, SC, began, and the contributions Gullah people made in the building of America.

Objectives: By the end of this presentation, students will be familiar with the Gullah language, how and why Africans came to the United States, and the challenges they encountered. 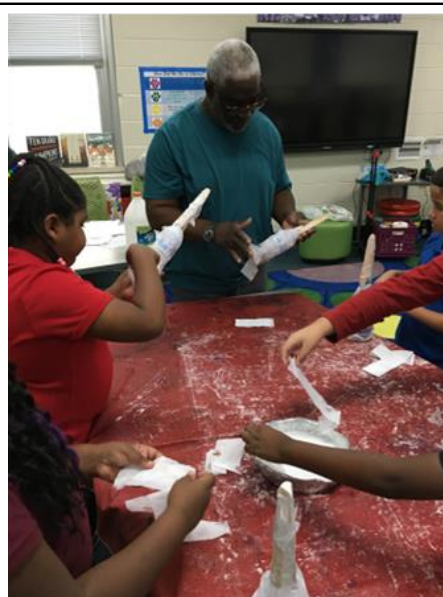
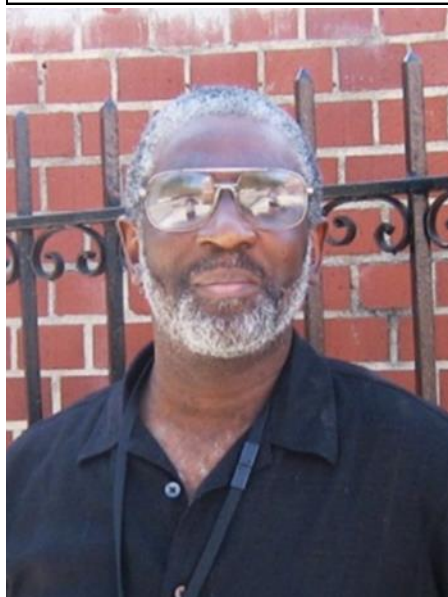

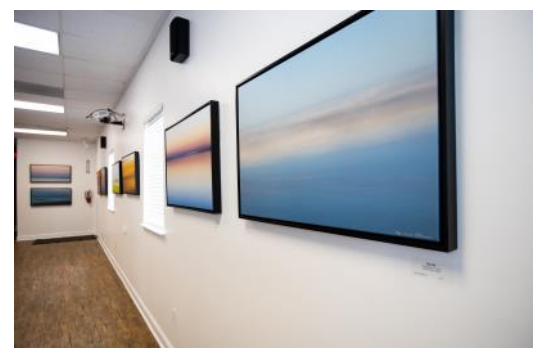
PARK CIRCLE GALLERY

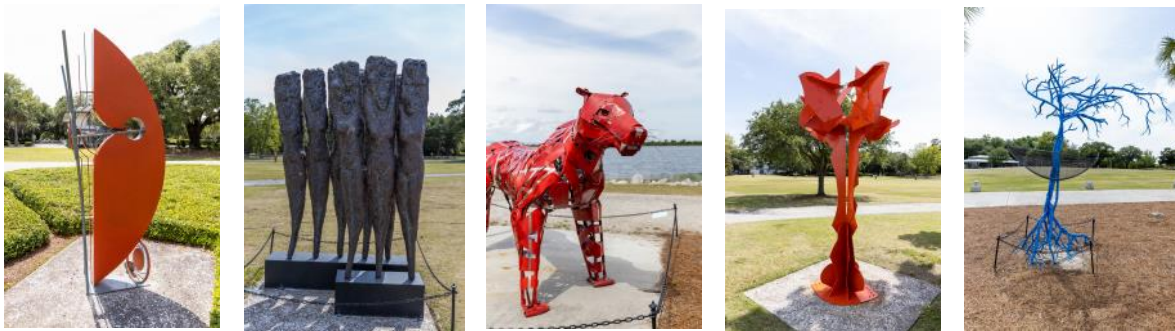

2023-2024 NATIONAL OUTDOOR SCULPTURE COMPETITION & EXHIBITION

Sculpture sites are located throughout the picturesque North Charleston Riverfront Park (1001 Everglades Avenue, North Charleston, SC 29405). Organized and presented by the City of North Charleston Cultural Arts Department, this unique exhibition offers established and emerging artists the opportunity to display their thought provoking, extraordinary sculptures as well as compete for up to \$19,750 in exhibition honorariums and awards.

Four permanent sculptures have been acquired by the City from past exhibitions. Riverfront Park is set on the banks of the peaceful Cooper River. Visitors enjoy ten acres of walking paths, a fishing pier, an over-sized sandbox, picnic pavilion, children's playground and play fountain, performance pavilion, and the Naval Base Memorial. With all these amenities, Riverfront Park makes a wonderful place to have school picnics in a beautiful setting while gaining exposure to the work of nationally acclaimed sculptors. NORTH CHARLESTON ARCHIVES & HISTORY

The history of North Charleston is rich and colorful. The Archives & History Room is located across from the Cultural Arts offices on the 2nd floor of North Charleston City Hall at 2500 City Hall Lane.
